

Regional Teachers Initiative for Africa - Facility

Overview

The European Union announced the launch of the [Regional Teachers Initiative for Africa \(RTIA\)](#) in February 2024, which aims to support African countries to improve the education and training of teachers and to make sure that their schools have enough qualified teachers.

The initiative will contribute to regional and national objectives by supporting and complementing national education and teacher reforms, offering opportunities for countries to work together, supporting partnerships and peer learning for teachers in the region, and also to work with Europe.

Within the RTIA, **the Facility**, supports regional and national initiatives aimed at providing quality education by operating through a multifaceted approach, which includes three complementary components.

The RTIA **Facility** is supported by France, Finland and Belgium. It complements the other two components of the RTIA, which focus on enhancing teacher professional development, support, and collaboration across Africa, and facilitating policy research, exchange and peer learning to ensure consistency between global, regional, and national efforts and are which are led by the African Union Commission and UNESCO respectively.

Research solutions that enhance research capacity and contribute to evidence-based policymaking.


Partners: Consortia of universities and research centres from Europe and Sub-Saharan Africa
